Fat minute: A long time.

Fax: That's true. So true, in fact, that I would fax it. No need to print to prove.

Fire: Exciting, outstanding, becoming popular.

Fit: Outfit.

FOMO: Fear Of Missing Out.

Foreves: A hip version of "Forever".

Fr: Abbreviated "For Real"

FTW: Internet slang, "For the win"

Fulp: A slang term hikers use to combine the words force and gulp.

Glow up: Makeover, an emotional or physical improvement or transformation.

Go ham: Go hard, being unstoppable, going crazy, going beast mode, raging.

Goat: Greatest Of All Time!

Gucci: Cool, awesome, chill.

Highkey: The opposite of lowkey, strong feelings, can mean loud, complimentary, a big deal.

Hot minute: A very long time, sometimes used in place of "hot second", or a very brief time.

Hyped up: Getting over excited, out of control, overstepping a boundary.

Iconic: Great approval, idolized, revered, quintessential, legendary. Similar to "classic".

IDEK: I don't even know!

Idk: Abbreviation for "I don't know". Young uns' are now verbalizing abbreviations. So efficient!

Ima: Short for "I am going to", as in "Ima hit the market for some pizza pockets!"

IRL: In Real Life.

Jenky: Strange, odd, poor quality, whack, messed up. Also spelled Janky, Jankey, and other ways.

Out of pocket: Can mean wild, extreme.

Poggers: An expression of excitement or amazement. **POG**: Play Of the Game. Good.

Rando: Random person, not known or recognized, unwelcome.

Rizz: Charisma, got game, magnetic charm.

Rn: Abbreviation for "Right Now"

Roasted: Verbally dissed, owned, put in your place.

Salty: upset

Schloose: A made-up verb to describe doing pretty much anything. "Hey bro, will you schloose the pizza into the oven at 4:30pm so we can eat when everyone gets home? That way nobody gets too hangry."

Ship: Relationship, to be a couple.

Sick: So cool that it's epic, dope, or fire.

Slaps: Amazing, excellent, impressive, and so on.

Slays: Something done exceptionally well, "Bro, you killed it out there." "Yeah, you slayed!" Dominated.

SOZ: Slang for informally saying "sorry", can also be used sarcastically, but Roz was sincere, tbh (to be honest).

Spilling tea: Gossiping to friends.

Spittin' bars: Rapping extremely well, freestyling.

Squat: Nothing, anything.

Supes: Super.

Sus: Suspicious, questionable, fishy.

Swaggerific: To be terrific, on point, absolutely amazing - to have swag.

Tbh: "To be honest" or sometimes "to be heard".

Throw shade: Insult, put down others.: Insult, put down others.

Top tier: The best, highest quality or rank, prestigious, most important.

Totes: Totally, completely.

Tryna: Trying to, want to, desire to; can be written as trynna.

Turnt down: Party pooper, lame-o, unfit for the current event.

Vibe: A feeling or sensation, short for "vibration", and can also mean to get along or agree, feel positive, lively, and vibrant.

Wack: Odd, uncool, unexpected, cringe* (see footnote for cringe).

Wumbo: The opposite of mini. As used by Patrick in Spongebob Squarepants. "I wumbo. You wumbo. He- she- me...wumbo. Wumboing; We'll have thee wumbo; Wumborama; Wumbology; the study of Wumbo. It's first grade."

Yeet: Throwing something very hard, very fast. Yikes!

Yo: Can be used to say hello, also an interjection or filler word.

YOLO: You Only Live Once, similar to Carpe Diem (Seize the Day). Do stuff.
